If they fall outside of the range they get referred. All the referrals then go on to Sight Savers. They keep a database and contact the families of all who are referred. If the families meet the requirements for assistance, Sight Savers will get them all the follow up care they need, from transportation to the eye doctor all the way to surgery if needed. If the families do not meet the requirements then they are given guidance on how to find a doctor and any other questions the family has the try to answer.</p>
