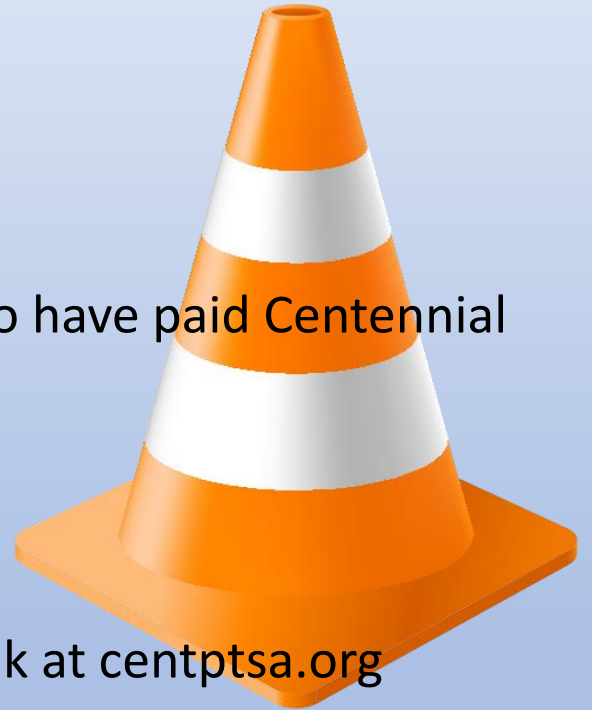

“Visit the college.”




“Help plan student’s college visits. Make sure they are happy with their choice. Happiness effects grades & performance.”




“Help your student self-assess ahead of time so that the student knows what they want from a college/university.”



# REQUESTING TRANSCRIPTS & LORs

## TRANSCRIPTS

Indicate, on the request card, which institution should receive the student's transcript. Also indicate the means by which the transcript should be submitted  
(electronically/via hard copy)

## LORs

Indicate, on the request card, whether your college/university requires a counselor letter of recommendation. Indicate the means by which it should be submitted.

If your college/university requires a letter of **recommendation**, enter your counselor's name & e-mail address, in the online college application, where counselor information is requested. If a **TEACHER** letter of recommendation is required, enter the teacher's name & e-mail address in the application where requested.

Attach a copy of the **SENIOR PROFILE** (both student & parent portions) to the transcript/recommendation request card

Track the delivery of your transcript and/or LORs, through your college account, to ensure that they have been received by the college/university.

## **CHS SENIOR PROFILE: Parent Questionnaire**

### **REQUIRED FOR REQUESTING LETTERS of RECOMMENDATIONS**

*Letters of Recommendation must to be requested at least 10 school days in advance of your deadline.*

If your student is requesting a letter of recommendation from his/her counselor for a college application or scholarship, we ask that parents complete this form. This information will assist the counselor in writing a recommendation which will fully highlight your student and his/her accomplishments. The more specific details you can give us, the more thorough the recommendation will be.

Once completed, save this file and email it to the counselor or print it out and have your student turn it in to the counseling office along with a letter of recommendation request and the student portion of the CHS Senior Profile.

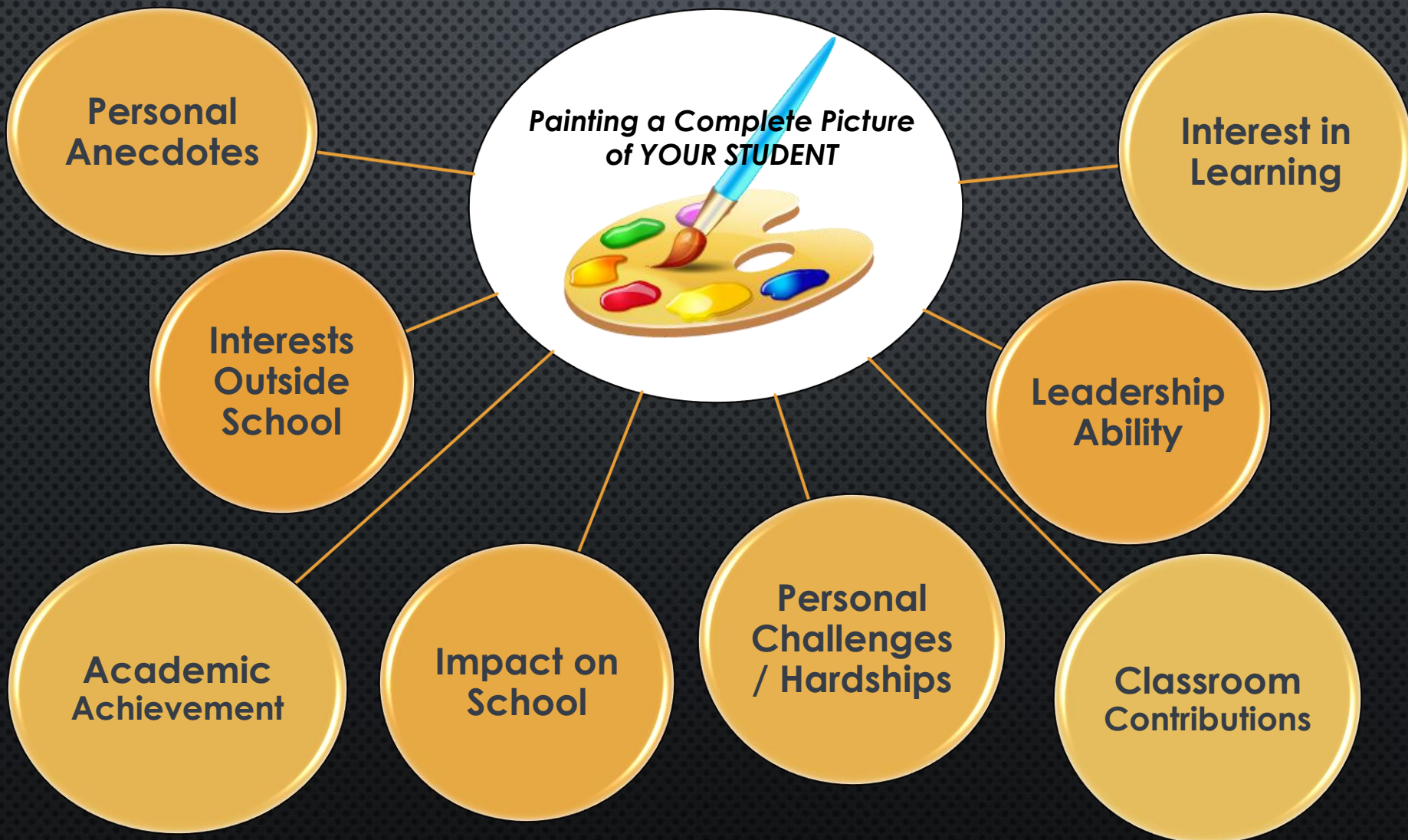

# OTHER RECOMMENDATION WRITERS



- TEACHERS, COACHES/CLUB SPONSORS, MENTORS, ADMINISTRATORS, ETC. MAY SERVE AS RECOMMENDERS
- ASK THE RECOMMENDER FOR PERMISSION FIRST
- PROVIDE THE RECOMMENDER A COPY OF YOUR SENIOR PROFILE
- PROVIDE A MINIMUM NOTICE OF 10 SCHOOL DAYS
- SUBMIT RECOMMENDERS NAME & E-MAIL INTO ONLINE APPLICATION

If the college does not require a letter of recommendation, they will not accept or review any letters submitted.

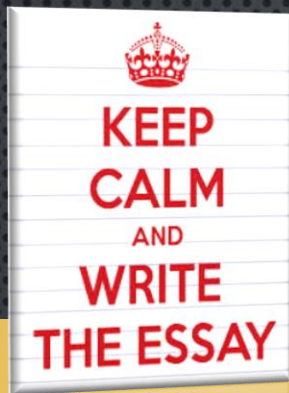
