Online student registration is now open for students who plan to attend the <u>Atlanta National College Fair</u> on Sunday, February 12, 2012 from 12-4pm at the Georgia World Congress Center. To register, visit <u>www.gotomyncf.com</u>.

When your students <u>register</u>, a bar coded confirmation page is produced. When printed and brought to the fair, this page acts as the



student's electronic ID. Utilizing this barcode eliminates the need for students to fill out inquiry cards at the booths they visit. Online registration leaves more time for students and parents to chat with more admissions representatives. Encourage your students to register before they come to the fair!

## Here is how the process works:

#### Step 1

Visit <a href="www.gotomyncf.com">www.gotomyncf.com</a> prior to attending the fair to register. Students will be asked a few short questions regarding their graduation information, home address, and interested major so schools can send them information after the Fair.

#### Step 2

Complete the <u>online registration form</u>. Print the barcode identification page and have students bring it along to the fair.

### Step 3

Colleges at the fair will scan the student's barcode to access their information, allowing more time for one-on-one conversations and less time filling out inquiry cards.

# For Counselors: Importing Student Data

At select college fairs counselors have the option to import all student data to a single NCF database. This process makes it easier for students and counselors to access their registration information.
