✓ How does it work?	<ul> <li>Only students with a final grade of 65-69 can participate. NO EXCEPTIONS! The student will be enrolled in 2 extra days of class (8 hours total) during the winter break and will retake the final exam for the course. Attendance on both days is mandatory. The student needs to earn a minimum score of at least 70% on the final exam retake. If the student is successful, then the final grade for the course will be replaced with a passing grade of a 70, earning full credit for the course.</li> </ul>
