CLASS SCHEDULE

Centennial High School's school year is comprised of 177 days. On Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays students have an 8-period day, during which they participate in a 31-minute elective seminar. Clas-

ses on these days are 52 minutes each. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, students follow a traditional 7-period schedule comprised of 57 minute classes and no elective seminar. CHS is on a semester schedule, and credit is awarded at the end of each semester. Grade reports are given at six weeks and twelve weeks, but the final semester grade is what appears on the transcript.

All honors, Advanced Placement, and college-level courses are given all passing grades.

Individual grades on the transcript do include the additional seven honors points.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE CALCULATION

Student numeric grade averages (NGA) are calculated on a 100 point scale. The calculation is an average of final semester grades of every attempted courses with the potential to earn high school credit.

CLASS RANK

Class rank is determined by comparing the numeric grade average of all twelfth grade students. The calculation includes the seven honors points awarded in all Honors and Advanced Placement courses. Student NGAs are computed at the conclusion of each semester.

CURRICULUM

Centennial High School offers a diverse curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of students who are seeking a challenging college preparatory experience. 93% of Centennial graduates attend institutions of higher learning. Centennial's curriculum offerings prepare students for the challenges beyond high school. Course offerings are determined by State of Georgia and Fulton County Board of Education requirements, student selection, availability of staff, and cost effectiveness.

Advanced Placement Course examinations are evaluated and scored on a five-point scale where a five is the highest score. Students scoring within the 3 to 5 score range are potentially eligible for college credit and are indicating their well-qualified college entrance performance.

Career and Technology Education Programs:

Broadcast Video Production, Health Science, Criminal Justice, Pre-Engineering, Computer Science, Family & Consumer Science, and JROTC.

Dual Enrollment and Post-Secondary Options are programs by which students can earn high school graduation credit for courses taken at post-secondary institutions. Courses are offered both on and off campus. The student is simultaneously enrolled at both institutions or may, in fact, attend the post-secondary institution altogether. A key element for this program is the fulfillment by students of the high school graduation requirements as set by the Board of Education.

Talented and Gifted Programs serve approximately 28.5% of Centennial's population. The program augments the classroom activities through seminars, subject extensions, independent or directed studies, and career internships.
