What Is Dual Enrollment?



- Dual enrollment provides qualified high school students with the opportunity to earn college credit while still enrolled in high school
- Dual Enrollment vs. AP

Course Details



- College English provided by Georgia Perimeter College
- 2 semester (year-long) commitment
- Currently meets MW or TR from 8:00 – 9:15 with instructor from GPC
- Three college credits and one high school credit earned per term for successful completion
- College credit is potentially transferable to other institutions
- Must maintain a “C” or better average
- Grade Conversion
 - $A = 95 + 7 = 102$
 - $B = 85 + 7 = 92$
 - $C = 75 + 7 = 82$
 - $D = 70 + 7 = 77$
 - $F = 60$

What Are The Admission Requirements?



- CHS Rising Senior
- Minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0 in core classes
- Minimum SAT score of 970 CR+M or ACT 20 composite
- Minimum SAT CR 480 and Math 440 or ACT English 20 Math 18
- Minimums do not guarantee acceptance and are subject to change
- Residency: Must reside in GA at least 12 months

Apply to GPC



- Complete application online at www.gpc.edu or www.gacollege411.org requesting dual enrollment status (note Alpharetta campus)
- Pay \$20 application fee
- Submit official high school transcript
 - Use *Dual Enrollment Intent Form* to make request
 - Submit form directly to Ms. White in the Counseling Office
- Submit official SAT/ACT scores
 - Must be requested directly from test agency
 - Must take one or both tests by the February/March test dates

Apply to GPC



- Submit additional items, including
 - Current certificate of immunization on GPC form
 - Parental Consent Form
 - Verification of Lawful Presence
- Adhere to deadlines
 - Intent form submission deadline is March 27, 2015
 - **Application submission deadline is March 31, 2015** All other required documents must be received by GPC by May 1, 2015
 - **CHS / Fulton County Schools deadlines must be met**

Payments / Funding



- ACCEL funding option pays in-state tuition for eligible students
- Students pay fees and book costs
- Students who use ACCEL will not be using their allotment of HOPE credits early
- Students must apply to ACCEL via www.gacollege411.org each term in order for tuition to be paid
- Failure to apply for funding in a timely manner may result in receiving a bill for tuition. Remember that costs other than tuition for approved courses are often solely the responsibility of the student.

Expectations



- Students will complete GPC application and submit materials **following CHS deadlines**
- Students will apply for ACCEL funding each semester
- Students will follow GPC processes and procedures and respond to college officials in a timely manner
- Students will have on-time attendance at all class meetings and will communicate any problems directly to the instructor (ahead of time if possible)
- Students will complete all assignments and adhere to all deadlines set forth by the GPC instructor
- Students must complete first semester course with a “C” or better average to continue second semester—the course meets the **senior English graduation requirement**
- Earned grades/credits will appear on both high school and college transcripts and are reportable to other colleges and universities
- Parents are not contacted by the GPC instructor—similar to any college course
