

Provides:

Classes and degrees directly aligned with a particular career or job field.

GA Technical College System - 99.3% placement rate within 6 months of student graduation. Approximately \$5,600 per year for full-time enrollment (Gwinnett Technical College)

- ACCUPLACER typically required
- SAT / ACT optional

Approximately \$3730 per year for full-time enrollment

- SAT / ACT or other admission test may be required

Two Year Junior College



Student Budgets, 2020-21

In 2020-21, average budgets for full-time undergraduate students range from \$18,550 for public two-year in-district students and \$26,820 for public four-year in-state students to \$43,280 for public four-year out-of-state students and \$54,880 for private nonprofit four-year students.

BUILDING YOUR COLLEGE LIST

"Reach schools" are those where your academic credentials fall below the school's range for the freshman class.

"Match schools" are schools where your academic credentials fall within or perhaps slightly exceed the school's range for the freshman class.

"Safety schools" are schools you will almost definitely get into because your academic credentials are much better than the typical range for their freshman class. **REACH SCHOOLS**



What is my GPA?


The numeric average of semester course grades including EVERY attempted high school course.








How to Access Your Assigned Tasks


To access your assigned Bridge Bill required tasks from your Naviance Student Home Page, click on **My Planner** and then **Tasks**.

All tasks will show in the Tasks you Need to Work On section to the left side of your screen.










- 1. Find Your Fit: Use tools like SuperMatch and Scattergrams to identify your best-fit college.

- Colleges will generally take scores from either test (SAT or ACT) and treat them equally

Types of Financial Aid

GRANTS

- GIFT-AID: DO NOT HAVE TO BE REPAID
- STATE OR FEDERAL MONEY
- PREDOMINANTLY NEED-BASED
- **Ex: Pell Grant, TEACH Grant**

SCHOLARSHIPS

- ODO NOT HAVE TO BE REPAID
- OMERIT-BASED (GPA, ATHLETICS, COMMUNITY SERVICE)
- ONEED-BASED (FAMILY INCOME)

WORK STUDY

- OMONEY YOU EARN WHILE WORKING
 - **ON CAMPUS**
 - DESIGNATED PLACES OF WORK FROM THE SCHOOL
- DOES NOT HAVE TO BE REPAID
- **PRIMARILY NEED-BASED**

LOANS

- OMUST BE REPAID WITH INTEREST
- GOVERNMENT MONEY
- PRIVATE VARYING TERMS & CONDITIONS

HOPE & Zell Miller Scholarships?

HOPE

3.0 GPA in core classes

Funding depends on the school with award limits

- Private vs. Public
- DOES NOT COVER 100%

ZELL MILLER

3.7 GPA in core classes

SAT score of 1200 combined (no super score) or ACT of 26 or valedictorian or salutatorian

Award limits

- Public = full tuition
- Private = tuition assistance

BOTH HOPE & Zell Miller

- Receive credit for 4 classes that meet the HOPE & Zell Miller rigor requirement.
- Complete the FAFSA
