

<u>CENTENNIAL'S PERSONAL FITNESS EXEMPTION</u> JEFF BURCH, ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

- Personal fitness is a graduation requirement; this class is taken either semester (fall or spring) during your senior year.
- Students can exempt personal fitness with <u>one</u> of the following:
 - GHSA option (I season of a sport)
 - Non GHSA Sports Option (I season)
 - Marching Band (I season of Marching Band)
 - Dance/PE Elective (.5 credit); or JROTC (1 year of JROTC).
- A freshman who plans to exempt personal fitness will be required to fill out a form when selecting electives.
- If you do not fulfill the exemption requirements by junior year, make sure to place personal fitness on your schedule for the purpose of graduation.

9TH GRADE LITERATURE

Ninth Grade Literature & Composition is a study of the major literary genres and themes across recorded history with an emphasis on informational texts.

While maintaining an intense reading emphasis, instruction will refine grammar, vocabulary, and writing skills, preparing students for success in 10th Grade Literature and Composition. As a result, students will learn to think and write critically about literature, both fictional and informational.

Throughout this year-long course, students will have opportunities to develop and expand their knowledge of literature and language and demonstrate their mastery level of new learning through performance tasks and assessments.
