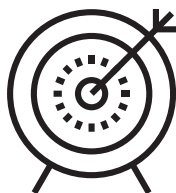

FOUNDATION FELLOWSHIP

Known as the university’s premier academic undergraduate scholarship, the Foundation Fellowship provides students with an abundance of opportunities throughout their time at the University of Georgia.



Annual stipend for non-Georgia resident students: \$21,400 plus a Presidential waiver (currently worth \$19,040 per year) and a first-year housing supplement



Three fully funded spring travel-study programs (first through third years, valued at \$9,900)



One fully funded summer study abroad program to Oxford University immediately following the first year (valued at \$8,500)



Individual travel-study grants up to a cumulative total of \$9,000



Research and academic conference grants up to a cumulative total of \$1,750



Faculty, peer and alumni mentoring

The application opens on the Admissions site in late August. The deadline for the application falls in early November each year; therefore, applicants must apply Early Action to be considered. Applicants are notified as to whether or not they are finalists for a Fellowship by late January. Finalists are invited to an interview weekend (which occurs in late February).

CURO HONORS SCHOLARS

CURO Honors Scholars receive \$3,000 in funding each year; enjoy mentoring and community support; and attend special seminars, workshops, events, and activities.

CURO Honors Scholars pursue their own research agenda in their first semester at UGA, and they can conduct research in any discipline at UGA, including (but not limited to) physical, biological, and social sciences; business; international affairs; engineering; humanities; and the fine and performing arts.

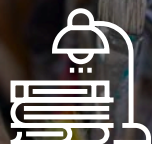
