CURRICULUM

Centennial High School offers a diverse curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of students who are seeking a challenging college preparatory experience. We are a one-to-one school where all students have a personal device (Surface Pro)and we leverage technology through Personalized Learning across our curriculum to meet students' needs. 87% of Centennial graduates attend institutions of higher learning. Centennial's curriculum offerings prepare students for the challenges beyond high school. Course offerings are determined by State of Georgia and Fulton County Board of Education requirements, student selection, availability of staff, and cost effectiveness.

Advanced Placement Course examinations are evaluated and scored on a five-point scale where a five is the highest score. Students scoring within the 3 to 5 score range are potentially eligible for college credit and are indicating their well-qualified college entrance performance.

Talented and Gifted Programs serve approximately 30.5% of Centennial's population. The program augments the classroom activities through

seminars, subject extensions, independent or directed studies, and career

Career and Technology Education Programs:

Audio/Visual Technology, Health Care Science, Criminal Justice, Pre-Engineering, Computer Science, Family & Consumer Science, and JROTC.

Dual Enrollment and Post-Secondary Options are programs by which students can earn high school graduation credit for courses taken at post-secondary institutions. Courses are offered both on and off campus. The student is simultaneously enrolled at both institutions or may, in fact, attend the post-secondary institution altogether. A key element for this program is the fulfillment by students of the high school graduation requirements as set by the Board of Education.
